### **regarding the Trans Alaska Pipeline System**

**Individuals who live in the states listed below are to refrain from traveling to Alaska for work until further notice. These states have high levels of community spread of COVID-19: California, Colorado, New York, Washington.**

**This is a “hold in place” strategy for the benefit of the health of those individuals and the TAPS workforce. This also applies to those who may have already traveled to Alaska in anticipation of reporting for an upcoming shift.**

**This does not apply to individuals traveling through airports in these states; only to those who reside in California, Colorado, New York, and Washington.**

**This direction applies to ALL TAPS workers. Employees of contractors should refer to their employer for information regarding pay, benefits, and next steps.**

# PROTECTING OURSELVES AND EACH OTHER AGAINST COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS)

## What happens at the virus screenings?

You will be asked (1) about recent travel to high-risk countries, (2) whether you have been in direct contact with an infected individual, and (3) whether you have any symptoms. Also, you will have your temperature taken.

## What happens if my screening outcome prevents me from being allowed to work?

You will not be able to access the facility. OHU & health contractors will work with you to arrange next steps & a future screening. HR personnel can assist with benefit application.

## What happens if I pass the screening?

You will receive a card or badge sticker verifying you passed & travel to your work location as scheduled.

## What if I am not being screened?

You are expected to self-screen at home before reporting to work.

## What actions can I take to stay safe and be prepared?



Clean hands with soap & water or alcohol-based hand rub, disinfect surfaces.



Avoid unprotected contact with live wild or farm animals.



Ensure you have necessary tools & access to work remotely.



Cover nose & mouth when coughing or sneezing with tissue or flexed elbow.



Avoid shaking hands and hugging.



Register with Teladoc so you are able to use the service if needed.



Make a plan to spend extended time at home.



Avoid touching your face.



Stay home if you are sick, & self-report to your supervisor.
